Practical Safeguarding: Update

The Action on Elder Abuse National Conference is a premier event for those involved in meeting the challenges within Adult Safeguarding in the new Big Society environment. Delegates attend from across government, social care, advocacy, the NHS, the legal profession and the voluntary sector. This is a must-attend event, where partnerships are formed and new relationships made.

We are delighted confirm that the annual AEA conference will take place on **Monday 28th and Tuesday 29th March 2011**, at the **Manchester Conference Centre**, Sackville Street, M1 3BB.

Day One will have a range of plenary speakers but will be streamed for the majority of the day into **three sub-conferences**, one on Health, one on Social Care, and one on Criminal Justice matters. **Day Two** will also have plenary speakers and there will morning and afternoon sessions of **workshops**, six in the morning and six in the afternoon, also streamed into Health, Social Care, and Criminal Justice matters.

Conference costs have been kept to a minimum this year, and are lower than any comparable event arranged by other organisations throughout the year.

For example, excluding VAT, Capita one day conferences are £350 for the public sector; £445 for Central Government; and £545 for the private sector. And similar Healthcare Event one day conferences are £365 for NHS Social Care and Universities; £300 for Voluntary sector groups; and £495 for commercial organisations.
