INPEA World View on Elder Abuse: Environmental Scan – Final Research Results and Implications for Global Policy and Practice

INPEA representatives will present **INPEA's World View on Elder Abuse** findings, an environmental scan of elder abuse conducted by INPEA with Ryerson University, Canada, University of Kentucky and Cleveland State University, USA. This first global survey gains an understanding and response to elder abuse across nations. Preliminary findings offered in past at the Gerontology Society of America, (GSA) but this is the first time final results have been presented. All 6 World Health Organization (WHO) regions are represented – over 50 countries and well over 300 responses in developing and developed countries. Six universities participated in global data collection.
